3-As we study the life of Moses leading up to his death and the transition of leadership to Joshua, what has impressed you about Moses and his "people skills?"

4-What has impressed you about God during this same time period?

5-Aaron, Moses' older brother, and Miriam, his older sister, both complain to Moses about his CUSHITE (Ethiopia?) wife. Why did they do this? How did God react?

6-In your family circle, do you ever have some "squabbles?" How and who resolve them?

7-God had told Moses previously to SPEAK to a rock and water would come forth. Later God will tell him again to SPEAK to a rock but Moses will take his rod and STRIKE it twice! As a result, Moses will be denied entrance to the Promised Land. What are your thoughts on this event?

8-Have you ever been in a situation where you became so angry that you STRUCK out at the people causing the problem? What happened?

9-Can't you just hear Moses saying: "ok you rebels, you want water? Where here it is- BAM! BAM!" Do you think 40 years of leading over 2 million people and countless herds, and flocks of animals finally took its toll on Moses?

10-God will take Moses to a mountain top so he can see into the Promised Land. Moses will die at the age of 120. GOD BURIES MOSES IN A SECRET PLACE KNOWN ONLY TO HIM--why do you think God did that?
