1-Did you ever go canoeing, white water rafting, or kayaking and fall in?

2-Have you ever been thirsty and say "water, water everywhere but none to drink?"

3-As the Hebrew nation approached the flooded banks of the Jordan River, what do you think the folks in the lead column thought and felt?

4-Why did the Ark of the Covenant lead the profession and was lifted on the shoulders of the priests?

5-What did the Ark represent to the people?

6-Joshua told the people to "consecrate" themselves before crossing the Jordan. What did that mean to them and what does it mean to us today?

7-For fun, why not list all the things you do on Sunday morning as you prepare to come to worship? How many of those items deal with "consecrating?"

8-This was a "new generation" of Hebrews who will enter the Promised Land as the older generation have all died (excluding Joshua and Caleb). Why then was this "miracle crossing" important to them and Joshua?

9-Verses 9-13 talk about the relationship between WORD and MIRACLE. What is that relationship and what does it mean for us today?

10-Have you ever had to cross a Jordan River in your spiritual journey? What happened? Was there anyone who helped you to cross over? Have you ever helped one to cross over their Jordan River?
